The Budget and Institutional Effectiveness

Cynthia Gibbs is President of Sage Horizons Consulting, Inc., a management consulting firm specializing in organization transformation, performance management, project management, strategic planning, and organizational effectiveness. Ms. Gibbs has directed and managed several assessment initiatives, including a 40-member team which conducted a Baldrige-based assessment of a 5000-member Air Force wing and she was a project manager of the Air Force's Baldrige-based organizational assessment program at the Pentagon. She was the lead consultant for a comprehensive assessment of the key business processes of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) in support of their multi-year, multi-million dollar transition to an enterpriselevel asset management system. She was the project manager for the design, build, and implementation of the Air Force's first On-line Course Management System; she served as a senior management consultant for the premier project management firm Robbins-Gioia, LLC, of Alexandria, VA; and she was a project management instructor for BAE Systems (North America), the Department of Energy, and Management Concepts, Inc., a firm specializing in project management training and certification. Ms. Gibbs will do a presentation linking budget and costs to goals and objectives and how that will facilitate conducting comprehensive assessments. Participants will gain insight into the relationship between planning, budgeting, and measuring effectiveness. Logic Models: Linking Program Activities to Program Outputs and Outcomes
The use of logic modeling is becoming more prevalent in program planning. As an
example, the Centers for Disease Control now requires that all grant proposals include
a logic model. This presentation will cover the basics of how to develop logic models
that communicate the link between program activities and results. It will first include
the development of SMART objectives as this defines the eventual program outputs
and outcomes. It will then review how to develop a logic model within the context of
the Program Assessment Rating Tool (PART). The PART is required by the Office of
Management and Budget and was developed to identify program strengths and
weaknesses. The final section of the presentation will review the costs of lack of
fidelity to logic models. Participants in this presentation will develop a beginning
understanding of developing goals and objectives, logic models, and how these
activities facilitate effective programs and evaluation.
